

Section Eight Resources & Amenities

8.1 Access to Personal Transport

According to the CSO, the private car continues to be the main means of transport for Irish workers and just over 55% of primary schoolchildren were driven to school by car in 2006¹⁵. Having access to a car, particularly in a predominantly rural county like Leitrim, is an important way of facilitating work, education, economic and social activities. Access to two cars in a household with two or more adults can be necessary, especially in areas where public transport services are poor. The marginalisation experienced by people without transport in rural areas, especially women, the elderly, the mobility impaired, the unemployed and young people, is acknowledged by the National Action Plan against Poverty and Social Exclusion (p. 29).

There is a lower percentage of households with no car in Leitrim (16.2%) than nationally (19.7%) and a higher percentage of households with one car (40.6%) in Leitrim than in the State (38.6%). The rate of two car ownership and the ownership of three cars or more is slightly higher in Leitrim than in the State.

At rural area level, Carrick-on-Shannon Rural Area has the highest rate of households with no car (17.4%), followed by Manorhamilton Rural Area. Mohill Rural Area has the highest rate of households with access to three cars or more.

At ED level 12 of the 78 EDs have a higher than the State average of households with no car. Over a fifth of the households in Garadice in Ballinamore Rural Area, Cloonclare in Manorhamilton Rural Area and Mohill in Mohill Rural Area have no car.

A total of 30 of the 78 DEDs in Leitrim have a lower than the national average of households with one car at ED level. Garadice in Ballinamore Rural Area, Cattan and Lisgillock in Mohill Rural Area and Kiltubbrid in Carrick-on-Shannon Rural Area have the lowest levels of households with one car. Oughteragh in Ballinamore Rural Area and Annaduff in Carrick-on-Shannon Rural Area have the highest rates of households with one car.

A total of 34 of the 78 DEDs in Leitrim have a lower than national average of households with two cars at ED level. Killarga and Kiltyclogher in Manorhamilton Rural Area and Yugan in Carrick-on-Shannon Rural Area have the lowest levels of households with two cars. Glenboy in Manorhamilton Rural Area and Castlefore in Mohill Rural Area have the highest levels of households with access to two cars.

8.2 PC Ownership and Access to the Internet

Ownership of a personal computer and access to the internet are becoming more and more necessary in society as an aid to communication and education. It should be noted that the information on PC ownership and access to the internet presented here refer to personal computer ownership and not to business ownership or access. According to the 2006 census, almost half of households (49%) in Leitrim own a computer. This is a significant increase on the figure for 2002 which was 33.6%, though still below the State average of 56.6%.

At rural area level, the rate of computer ownership increased in all rural areas between 2002 and 2006. Carrick-on-Shannon Rural Area and Manorhamilton Rural Area had the highest level of computer ownership. Mohill Rural Area and Ballinamore Rural Area had the lowest levels.

At ED level there was a lower than the State average of households with a PC in 69 of the 78 DEs in Leitrim. Oughteragh and Drumreilly South in Ballinamore Rural Area and Glenfarn and Glenaniff in Manorhamilton Rural Area had the lowest levels. Glenboyn in Manorhamilton Rural Area has the highest rate.

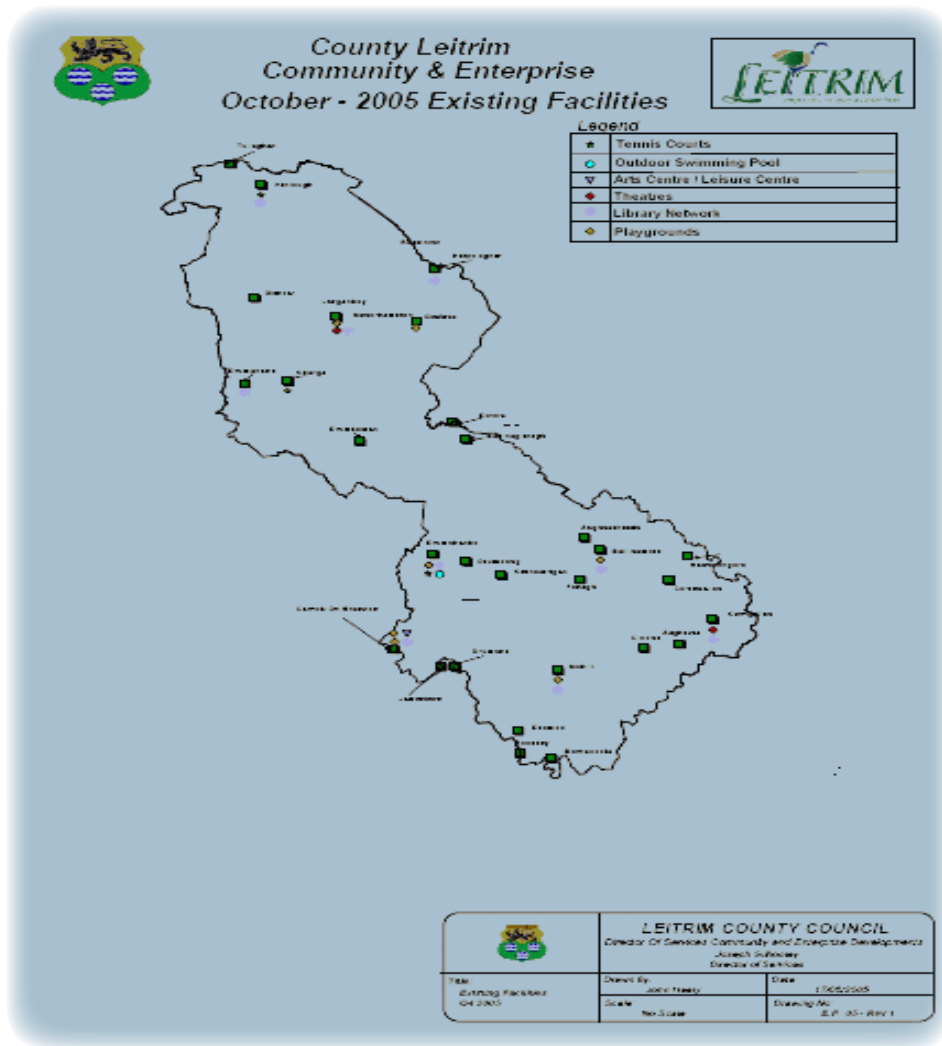

In total, 38.6% of households in Leitrim have access to the Internet, 7.8% of these are connected via broadband. Whilst this is still substantially lower than the State average, it is significantly higher than the figure in 2002 of 25.4%. Carrick-on-Shannon Rural Area has the highest rate of access to the Internet and Kinlough Rural Area has the lowest rate of access.

With regard to internet access at ED level there is a lower than the State average of households with access to the internet in 71 of the 78 DEDs in Leitrim. Glenfarn in Manorhamilton Rural Area and Melvin/Aghavoghill in Kinlough Rural Area have the lowest rates of internet access. Gortnagullion and Annaduff in Carrick-on-Shannon Rural Area have the highest rates.

8.4 Conclusion and Commentary

The rate of car ownership in Leitrim is higher than the State. However, over 16% of households have no car in Leitrim, the largest proportion of which are in Carrick-on-Shannon Rural Area.

Almost half of households in Leitrim now have a computer, a significant increase on the figure of a third in 2002, and the rate of computer ownership increased in all the rural areas. At ED level, at least a quarter of households in all EDs have a computer. Access to the Internet also improved significantly with almost 40% of households in Leitrim having access to the Internet, though the 7.8% who have access via broadband is significantly lower than the national average of 20%. At ED level at least a quarter of households in all EDs now have access to the Internet.
